About the Test

The MET Go! Writing test measures emerging through low intermediate English language ability. The test takes 30 minutes and is comprised of three parts designed to give test takers the opportunity to write on different topics:

- Part 1: Write a story based on three pictures
- Part 2: Write a note about personal experience
- Part 3: State and support a preference

How to Practice

To practice for the MET Go! Writing test, we recommend you read the sample responses. These responses represent a range of levels of MET Go! test takers. As you read them, think about how the test takers complete each part of the test and pay attention to linguistic features such as grammar, word choice, and spelling.

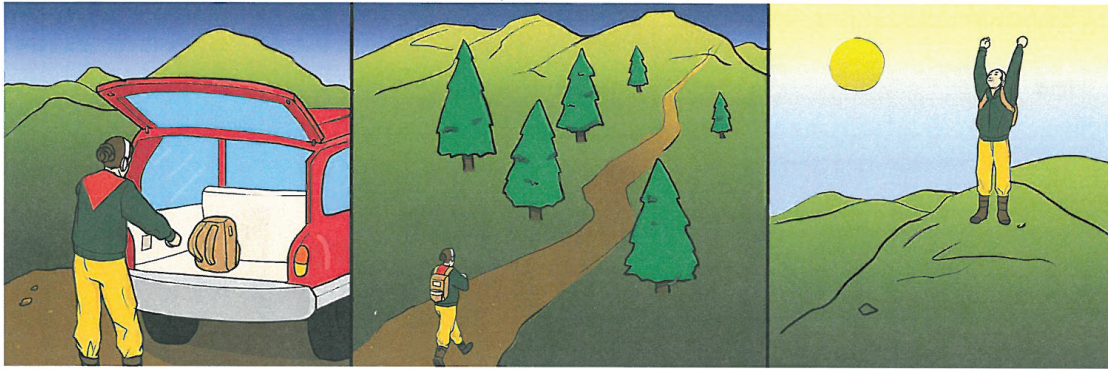
Sample 2 Commentary

- In Part 1, the test taker describes some of the people and objects pictured, but does not tell a story.
 - In Part 2, the test taker writes about their favorite food and how it is made, but does not mention whom they usually eat the food with.
 - In Part 3, the test taker states a preference (“I like a adventures in nature”) and gives some reasons to support it. However, the response is not fully developed and does not meet the 2-paragraph requirement.
- The test taker shows that they are able to use some simple grammar. They use verb tenses consistently. However, the grammar is not always accurate (“I love the thurist a the center Mexico food clasic”), which might cause the reader to guess what the test taker was trying to communicate.
 - The test taker makes some spelling errors (“bich,” “gir,”) and uses non-English words at times (“jugosa”), which the reader might not understand.
 - The test taker should work on using simple punctuation like periods and commas to organize their sentences.

Sample 3 Commentary

- In Part 1, the test taker fully describes each of the pictures. The test taker could work on making a story about what happens in the pictures.
 - In Part 2, the test taker writes about an adventure, talking about each of the bullet points.
 - In Part 3, the test taker talks about their preference (“I prefer eating at home with their family”) and explains some reasons why (“eating in my house is very cheap”).
- The grammar used in the response is mostly accurate. There are a few errors that the reader must re-read in order to understand (“I afer down,” “they are beautiful persons and they are very heart”). The test taker sometimes mixes present tense and past tense, such as in Part 2.
 - The test taker shows that they know how to use simple vocabulary well, despite some repetition of words.
 - Spelling, punctuation and capitalization is generally correct.

Sample 4 Commentary

- In Part 1, the test taker creates a story about the three pictures, describing what the main character was doing and how she felt.
- In Part 2, the test taker writes about an adventure they had. In addition to talking about each of the three bullet points, they also include many details about the adventure.
- In Part 3, the test taker discusses the advantages and disadvantages of eating at home and eating at restaurants. They then state their preference (“I prefer to eat at restaurants with my family”) and fully explain the reasons for this opinion.
- The test taker shows that they are able to use simple grammar very accurately. Occasional errors occur, but the reader can still understand the response. The test taker shows that they are able to use grammar to write in an abstract way.
- The test taker uses simple vocabulary and even some more advanced vocabulary in the response (“satisfied,” “darkness,” “anxious”).
- The response is very easy for the reader to follow due to the organization and connectors used (“finally,” “to make matters worse,” “To begin with”).
- Spelling, punctuation and capitalization is almost always correct.
